Objectives: 1. Students will be able to understand that similarly charged particles (proton-proton and electron-electron) repel each other while oppositely charged particles (proton-electron) attract each other and how electrons are transferred between two atoms.

## **Balloons and Static Electricity - PhET Contribution**

When you rub the balloon on the clothing, some of the electrons

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(which are negatively charged) from the cloth transferred to the balloon. This left an imbalance of electrons, making the balloon more negative. This electron imbalance is called static electricity.
