Members of a boards are addressed as Mr./Ms./Dr./ whatever honorific they typically use + name and are identified as a member or chairman of a board of (name of board). GOVERNORS E.g., while a member of a board of governors might be referred to in the third person as a 'governor' as in the sentence "The full term of a governor is fourteen years" ... they are not addressed as Governor (name) .

This is the second part of a two-part series. Through our ongoing work with boards, we began to ask the question: Are there specific aspects of a board chair role that, if demonstrated at a very high level, are most likely to make the difference between a good board and a great one?. We found that the answer is yes, there are actually two.

Board Chair: The Compass of the Nonprofit Board - Boardable

Board chair practices to be a fundraising champion: Set an expectation of 100% board giving each

year and personally talk to each board member about that expectation. Establish an annual pledge ceremony. Once a year, include board giving on the agenda and prepare board members by asking them to bring their checkbooks or credit cards.

Typically, the board chooses one of its members to be the chairman (often now called the "chair" or "chairperson"), who holds whatever title is specified in the by-laws or articles of association. However, in membership organizations, the members elect the president of the organization and the president becomes the board chair, unless the by-laws say otherwise.

About the Board. The five-member County Board is Arlington's governing body, vested with its legislative powers. Board Members, elected at large, serve staggered four-year terms. The positions of Chair and Vice Chair rotate annually. The County Board elects the Chair and Vice Chair at the January Organizational Meeting.

A great board chair does not provide "cover" for the executive director, ensuring those big bad board members don't make her life miserable. "Cover" implies a protection and ED's do not and should not have protection; they should have support. A great board chair does not run the organization. The ED does this.
