How Grammaticalization Processes Create Grammar

In historical linguistics and discourse analysis, grammaticalization is a type of semantic change by which (a) a lexical item or construction changes into one that serves a grammatical function, or (b) a grammatical item develops a new grammatical function.

Definition and Examples of Grammaticalization

In the process of grammaticalization, an uninflected lexical word (or content word) is transformed into a grammar word (or function word). The process by which the word leaves its word class and enters another is not sudden, but occurs by a gradual series of individual shifts.

Introduction. In its broadest sense, grammaticalization, also known as grammaticization, is the process by which grammar is created (Cro 2006: 366), for the study of this process. The term is thought to have originated with Meillet (1895, but first published 1902) who was interested in identifying how new categories and system changes arise.

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Reduced to its essentials, grammaticalization theory begins with the observation that grammatical

morphemes develop gradually out of lexical morphemes or combinations of lexical morphemes with lexical or grammatical morphemes (Bybee, Perkins & Pagliuca 1994: 4).

It attempts a terminological clarification of both terms independently from each other and examines their mutual relations. It proposes the hypothesis that fundamental features of grammar itself are rooted in pragmatics, and that therefore there is reason to interpret pragmaticalisation as an integral part of grammaticalisation.

Once underway, the course of grammaticalization is unidirectional and thus in principle predictable. Nouns and verbs lose their categorical status and become prepositions, auxiliaries and other grammatical forms. Free elements become more restricted and fuse with other elements.
