Note the use of tenses, the agreement between the passive reporting verb and the noun phrase, and the use of standard and perfect infinitives. Pattern: There is/are + passive verb + to be/to have been + noun phrase; Verbs used like this include: feel, presume, report, say, think, understand.

We use reported speech when the agent (doer of the action) is to be made prominent and we use passive voice when we the person or object on which the action is done is to be made prominent. In such cases the agent with 'by' is usually avoided.

Examples of Active and Passive Voice
