## **Syntactic Categories and Grammatical Relations: The ...**

Definition: A syntactic category is a set of words and/or phrases in a language which share a significant number of common characteristics. The classification is based on similar structure and sameness of distribution (the structural relationships between these elements and other items in a larger grammatical structure), and not on meaning.

A syntactic category is a type of syntactic unit that theories of syntax assume. Word classes, largely corresponding to traditional parts of speech (e.g. noun, verb, preposition, etc.), are syntactic categories. In phrase structure grammars, the phrasal categories (e.g. noun phrase, verb phrase, prepositional phrase, etc.) are also syntactic categories. ...

## **Lexical and grammatical categories**

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Clauses and clause elements (Most of the links in this handout go to the glossary of grammatical terms where you will find more explanations/examples than can be given in the handout.). Clause element (constituent): a word/phrase/clause that fulfils a syntactic function in a clause or a sentence 1. Peter is reading. 2. He is reading a thick novel.

## **Syntactic functions:**

Syntactic categories differ in size and expandability; some are OPEN CLASSES and some are CLOSED CLASSES. Most syntactic categories, like N and V, are open classes, since new nouns and verbs can be added freely to vocabulary. There is also correlation between the openness of a class and the meaning of its members.

A grammatical function: is what a particular word, phrase or clause does, the role it serves in a clause— subject, predicate, complement, adjunct, supplement, and so on. An example can be seen in the diagram link (above right). may take form with a word, phrase or clause.

Grammatical Relations Grammatical Relations (GRs) are relations between words in sentences. These are much more clearly defined than semantic roles, since they involve human interaction with communicated content. Because our minds are finite, we must always "carve out" (i.e., create) bounded categories from inherently unbounded semantic space.

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
