Gadamer and the Philosophical Hermeneutics Gadamer is based on Heidegger's philosophy when criticizing Dilthey. Heidegger gave him the opportunity to base hermeneutics linguistically, ontologically and aesthetically. "My personal effort goes back to the birth of the philosophical development of Dilthey from the legacy of German romanticism.

Hans Georg Gadamer and the Philosophical Hermeneutics ...

Gadamer's philosophical project, as explained in Truth and Method, was to elaborate on the concept of " philosophical hermeneutics ", which Heidegger initiated but never dealt with at length. Gadamer's goal was to uncover the nature of human understanding. In Truth and Method, Gadamer argued that "truth" and "method" were at odds with one another.

Thus, hermeneutics was a branch of theology that dealt specifically with the interpretation of holy scriptures but has since expanded beyond textual interpretation to encompass the interpretation of verbal (speech) and non-verbal (conduct) expressions. The use of Gadamerian hermeneutics in legal interpretation is well documented.
