An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.

Definition/Description: An anticipation guide is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and get students excited and curious about a new topic. After students are familiar with anticipation guides, "let them in" on the thinking you use to choose the statements in the left-hand column. Using text that is at or close to their independent reading level, ask students to make an anticipation guide that they could share with their peers.

Anticipation Guide - Comprehension Strategies
