Relevant – does the goal make sense to the project? e.g. This would assist in making the company run much smoother. Time bound – The deadline must be within the realm of possibility. e.g. By the end of Q3. Normally the SMART system is set for personal use or for managers to take the goal creating into their own hands.
