In his essay Structure, Sign and Play in the Discourse of Human Science, Derrida firstly describes the idea of freeplay, which is a decentering of systems within the systems themselves. Centering of systems is supposed to limit freeplay, yet this centering of systems, deisgned to give coherence to the system, is contradictory because it is there by force of desire, not by any fundamental principle.
