Timaeus The Timaeus is Plato's attempt to describe how the world came into being. Plato states that it is only a "likely story" (29d); nonetheless, it is an excellent summary of Platonic metaphysics and was extremely influential later in antiquity.

In Plato's works, Timaeus appears as a wealthy aristocrat from the Greek colony of Lokroi Epizephyrioi (present-day Locri in Calabria), who had served in high offices in his native town before coming to Athens, where the dialogue of Timaeus is set. Plato does not explicitly label Timaeus a Pythagorean, but leaves enough hints for the reader to infer this.
