\_\_\_\_\_ volcanoes are steep slope cone shaped and formed from thick lava with ash cinders and bombs. Cinder cone \_\_\_\_\_ is a fast moving hot lava that looks like rope-like coils or a solid mass of wrinkles. Pahoehoe \_\_\_\_\_ is a cooler, slower moving lava. When it hardens, it forms a rough

surface with jagged chunks.
